# Grade 1/2

In literacy we have been working on our reading and writing. We wrote letters to Santa last week and walked to the Post Office to mail them out. I hope we get a reply before our Christmas break! Grade 1's continue to work on writing sentences starting with a capital and ending with a period. Grade 1's are also working on reading strategies to use when they come across a word they do not know. Grade 2's have been busy working on using proper grammar in their writing and they are developing their understanding around verbs and syllables.

In math, the grade 1's have been working on adding and subtracting. We have talked about some strategies to use to find the answer such as a number line or manipulatives. The grade 2's have finished up place value and have begun working with fact families and understanding the connection between addition and subtraction. In Science we have started talking about living and nonliving things. We are talking about the characteristics of living things such as plants, animals and humans.

The count down is on to Christmas break, I hope everyone has a wonderful and restful holiday!

Hello everyone!

# Here is a snap shot about what is going on in grade 3/4:

<u>Math:</u> In math we have wrapped up our subtraction unit and are enjoying some winter themed math mysteries that are testing our math skills. Ask your student who was the Selfish Elf and who was responsible for stealing Santa's Sleigh!

**ELA:** In ELA we are continuing to work on making meaningful summaries of the texts that we have read. We are working on using the 5 Finger summary strategy to help us with this skill. We are also working on books that we are publishing with illustrations that follow our mentor texts, How to Catch and Elf and How to Catch a Snowman.

<u>Science</u>: In science we are working on conducting experiments that demonstrate the basic properties of light.

<u>Social Studies</u>: In social studies we are moving away from mapping and are looking instead to world communities- we are currently "traveling" around the world to see how different communities in the world celebrate Christmas.

I hope that everyone has an enjoyable week and I hope to see you at the Christmas Concert on Wednesday. Stay warm everyone!
