## The Great Library Escapell


I wanted to introduce something different, challenging, and group orientated as a new fun twist for this month. That's how The Great Library Escape came to be!!!




We will continue to work on sight words during literacy time. Check out the top 50 sight words list that help with early literacy skills.

In Math, we will continue working on subitizing. Now what on earth is subitizing, you may ask???

Subitizing means to instantly see how many. Having the ability to visualize and understand numbers helps to support the ability to add and subtract mentally and see relationships between numbers.

Try it out with your child, they're getting pretty good at it!







In literacy we continue to work on spelling and reading high frequency sight words. Gr 1's have been working on summarizing beginning middle and end of stories. Grade 2's have been reading stories and writing letters to the author. Grade 2's will start a novel study this week on the book The Littles with comprehension questions on each chapter!

In math we continue to work on counting to 100 by 2's and counting backwards from 100. We are working hard on our mental math. Grade 1's are working on friends of ten (numbers that add up to 10), doubles to 12 and numbers that are 2 more and 2 less. Grade 2's are working on mental math strategies of adding 9 and 11 and solving word problems. Please take time to practice these math facts at home, as it helps immensely!

In Social Studies we have been talking about what a community is and what our community has in it. We have also been talking about community helpers and what we want to be when we grow up.
