


Kindergarfen!



The grade 2s will be focusing this week on writing their own stories with a clear beginning, middle and end, while the grade 1s continue to practice constructing a sentence that begins with a capital and ends with a period.

In math, we have wrapped up our unit on representing numbers. This week we will start our unit on addition and subtraction. The grade 1s will be focusing on adding doubles, while the grade 2s focus on adding doubles +1.

Hello everyone,

I hope that you are all doing well and enjoying our milder temperatures.

Here are some of the topics that we are learning about right now:

ELA: We are practicing our reading comprehension strategies and are working on picking out words we don't know during our Charlotte's Web read aloud. We are also working on comparing texts and making connections to what we read.

<u>Math</u>: In math the Grade 3s are focusing on 2-digit addition and will soon be moving to three-digit addition late in the week.
