

### Grade 7/8 ELA

Reading – We have taken a pause on our read aloud book- A Year in the Life of a Total and Complete Genius as we read some books for our Sharing Circles. Students are reading 5 different books in groups of 3 or 4 students. Students will meet 4 or 5 times to discuss their books.

<u>Genius hour</u> partner presentations are starting today.

<u>Word Work</u> is every Day 2 and students will have a week to complete the assignments from these lessons.

Writing- we have done some exploring within the genre of logbooks/ diary entries/ journals.
